

Tennessee Naturalist Program Wild Edible Foray

The Tennessee Naturalist Program is offering a Wild Edible Foray at Cheatham Wildlife Management Area on March 18, 2017 from 10:00AM-3:00PM. Registration is required. Please visit the TN Naturalist Program website at www.tnnaturalist.org and look under the Continuing Education tab to register and pay class fees. The cost is \$50.00 per person. Polly Rooker, Pandy English and Windy Hunter are 3 experienced foragers of woods, fields and streams. Everything from breads, preserves, teas, tonics, poultices, dyes, greens, roots, dried fruits, nuts and natural medicinals will be shared. Participants will learn the skills of wild foraging as well as how to prepare the harvest. Safe identification will also be stressed. This event will take place rain or shine at the Cheatham WMA Checking Station Pavilion. Participants must dress appropriately. This includes boots, pants, gloves, rain gear and insect repellents. Snacks and water will be made available but bring a sack lunch. There will not be enough time to leave the site for lunch.
