### **Tennessee Naturalist Program**

The Tennessee Naturalist Program (TNP) is an education training course designed to introduce the natural history of Tennessee to interested adults.

The course provides a minimum of 40 hours of instruction, half in the classroom, half in the field. To become certified as a Tennessee Naturalist, participants must complete the course and a minimum 40 hours of approved

volunteer service.

Graduates join a critical corps of Tennessee Naturalist volunteers providing education, outreach, and service dedicated to the appreciation, understanding and beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within their communities.
