

TNP HONORARY AWARDS

TNP is excited to announce a series of new honorary awards that will celebrate high-achieving Tennessee Naturalists and Chapter Coordinators while honoring some of the most influential individuals in TNP's history.

The board of directors would like to recognize key individuals whose hard work and passion for our mission are responsible for our inception, growth, and success. At the same time, we hope to inspire our students to continue our mission.

Award winners are based on 2025 data and will be announced in January 2026.

- **Pandy Upchurch** was among the very first individuals to pursue a naturalist program in Tennessee and devoted untold hours as board chair for the first nine years. She is the retired TWRA assistance chief of biodiversity. The **Pandy Upchurch Stewardship Award** will go to the student earning the most volunteer hours in the Stewardship category in 2025.
- Nancy Garden was Education Director at Owl's Hill before retiring and coming to work parttime for TNP as the State Chapter Coordinator. The Nancy Garden Environmental Education Award will go to the student earning the most volunteer hours in the Environmental Education category in 2025.
- **Dr. David Hill** was TNP's first "president" and chapter coordinator and a retired university biology professor. The **David Hill Continuing Education Award** will go to the student earning the most continuing education hours in 2025.
- Margaret Cameron was our first chapter coordinator at Owl's Hill where the program began.
 The site became our laboratory to experiment and refine the program. The Margaret
 Cameron Coordinator Award will go to the coordinator of the chapter earning the most student certifications in 2025.
- The final award honors our most recent board chair, Kristin Hopkins, whose fierce
 dedication to this program has allowed us to grow into the organization we wish we could
 have been from the start capably managing and directing the Tennessee Naturalist
 Program on all levels. The Kristin Hopkins Volunteer Award will go to the student earning
 the most volunteer hours in 2025.

We owe these five individuals a debt of gratitude that cannot be repaid except to continue our work to make this program the best it can be serving our mission — "Inspiring the desire to learn and share Tennessee's nature."

TN2: Bird Banding and Avian Research

Come explore Warner Park Nature Center's bird program and legacy of avian research. This class will explain the important role of volunteers and community citizen science in ornithology and detail species-specific research projects such as Ruby-throated Hummingbird, Purple Martin, Northern Saw-whet Owl, and Eastern Bluebirds. You will also engage in a Motus radio-tracking exercise and end the day observing a park bird banding session.




